NEW HAMPSHIRE MUSIC FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES 2014 SUMMER SEASON

The festival's 62nd season, "The Romantic Spirit," will explore many aspects of Romanticism and celebrate the power and intimacy of live music

PLYMOUTH, NH, FEBRUARY 24, 2014 – The New Hampshire Music Festival (NHMF) announced its 2014 summer season today. With a theme of "**The Romantic Spirit**," the six-week season, July 8-August 14, will explore and celebrate the many facets of Romanticism, from the 18th century to the modern day.

The 62nd festival will take place in multiple venues throughout central New Hampshire. The Silver Center at Plymouth State University is the festival's primary venue, where it will offer full orchestra performances on Thursdays and Saturdays, and Tuesday night chamber performances.

"We will not only perform music we all know and love, from a beloved Mendelssohn overture to Tchaikovsky's towering masterpiece, his Fifth Symphony, but we will present new and exciting music, fulfilling our need and desire to keep music a living art form," said **NHMF Music Director Donato Cabrera**. "We also welcome to the NHMF family **Dan Perkins**, our new principal guest conductor, who will prepare the chorus for Verdi's epic *Requiem*."

Highlights of the season include concertos by **Vivaldi, Mozart, Piazzolla, Milhaud, Conus,** and **Copland**, and the festival will welcome four internationally renowned soloists to sing **Verdi's** *Requiem*. **Composer Nathaniel Stookey** will be the first contemporary composer in a new concert series called **Composer Portraits**. Stookey's *The Composer is Dead*, with the composer himself acting as narrator, and his newly composed overture, *Go!*, will be featured.

About The New Hampshire Music Festival

The New Hampshire Music Festival is a six-week summer music festival that honors the tradition of classical music while exploring new artistic paths. The NHMF strives to connect the Lakes Region with an engaging, immersive festival experience by presenting world-class performances, creating strong collaborations with community partners, and offering educational programs to students of all ages.

The festival was founded in 1952 as a small chamber orchestra performing on Melody Island in Lake Winnipesaukee and has grown to be a highly-valued community asset. Every summer during July and August, musicians from around the country come to Plymouth to perform well-known classics and contemporary works.

Maestro Donato Cabrera, who had his first season at the helm of the festival in Summer 2013, enjoys an international career as a music director and conductor. Last year, he expanded the festival's orchestral and chamber concerts, and reestablished the family concert series. In addition to his role at NHMF, he is the music director of the California Symphony and Green Bay Symphony, and is resident conductor of the San Francisco Symphony (SFS) and the Wattis Foundation Music Director of the San Francisco Symphony Youth Orchestra (SFSYO). www.donatocabrera.com
